

St. Ann's School:



St. Ann's School was the first educational institution of the Congregation of the Apostolic Carmel Sisters started in 1870 to provide sound Catholic education. St. Ann is the Patron Saint of the School. She is a model for teachers and mothers as she was a woman of deep faith, solid piety and great charity. In her sterling virtues students have an idea to emulate and a shining example to follow. The torch of Education lit in 1870 is still a living flame and the **motto** "EXCELSIOR" indicates the goal "Always Higher, Always Greater, Always Nobler".

VISION:

Drawing inspiration from Jesus Christ, the Supreme teacher, protection from our Lady of Mount Carmel and direction from our foundress Mother Veronica, and expressing solidarity with all people, St. Ann's High School envisages the building of a God oriented educative community to develop them as the precious Human resource of our Society.

HISTORY

The torch lit in 1870 is still a living flame providing 'Excelsior' as it lights up fresh spots to venture into; stressing as it were the endlessness of a good education. Sr. Elias,

torch bearer for the first three years handed over the growing responsibility to Sr. Aloysia in 1873, a parishioner of Rosario Church, who cut out by the Master's hand for an unusual venture, for a fully dedicated 36 years proved herself an excellent educator with tremendous courage and an inborn farsightedness. Step by step they marched forward through the years as they still keep doing, dependent on a never failing Protector.

The history of St. Ann's, as an educational institution, goes back to the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Apparition, who were invited by Bishop Michael Antony to open a school for girls, which they did in 1859, the School was housed in an old building called the 'Bungalow. In 1866 a gable of the building gave way. On another day the roof fell in with serious consequences. One girl died and several were injured. The school had to be closed down and the whole establishment moved to Jeppu. Later, Bishop Michael Antony got the old building- the 'Bungalow' completely overhauled and called it 'St. Ann's'. Here they started a small school. This was the school that the Apostolic Carmel Sisters took over on their arrival in Mangalore in 1870.

In 1874, the ground floor of St. Ann's main school building was constructed for the ever



increasing number of pupils that sought admission. The Girls were thence forward prepared for a Departmental examination and the school was placed under the salary grant system.

It will be in place to quote the letter of recommendation of the Education department issued by the First Inspector of schools Mr. L. Gaithwaite after his inspection dated April 22, 1878.

"The St. Ann's Girls School has always been favourably reported on by me. Its usefulness is unquestionable and is well thought of by all classes of the community in Mangalore. The nuns who teach on the staff have set a most laudable example by passing the literary tests for a Teacher's certificate".

In the meantime the south Kanara passed into the hands of the Jesuits, the worldwide reputed educationists. The Rev. Fr. Urban Stein S.J from St. Mary's College, Bombay was appointed Manager of St. Ann's Girls High school in January 1879.

During the School 1884 - 1888 the Institution was raise to the status of a High School, government recognition was secured and the school was brought in line with other institution.

In 1885 St. Ann's Kanarese School was opened and in 1887 shifted to Dongerkery and renamed "The Victoria caste Girl's School". In 1891 the school received Government Recognition as a Lower Secondary Middle School. In 1892 it switched over to English Medium.

St. Ann's School continued to grow under the matchless leadership of Mother Aloysia. The first junior Intermediate class was started in a small cottage on the St. Ann's campus in 1920, which proved to be the cradle of St. Agnes College. In 1921 came an unexpected turn in the tide of affairs at St. Ann's. The three higher classes viz. From IV, V and VI were shifted to St. Agnes, Bendore to ensure a perennial flow of students for the newly opened St. Agnes College. St. Ann's was mute with pain over its loss. In reality though it was seed time and the blossom appeared in 1934 when the middle school with its excellent standard was gladly upgraded into St. Ann's Girls High School. The St. Ann's High School at Pandeshwar introduced Kannada Medium in 1946. The English Medium Primary School and Kannada Primary Schools subsequently became independent units with their own buildings.

St. Ann's High School was upgraded to **St. Ann's Composite P.U College** in the academic year 1997- 98. Various combinations available are

1. Science - PCMB, PCMC

2. Commerce - HEBA, EBAC, ESBA

3. Arts - HEPS



ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS:

A company of the Bharat Girl Guides- Kasturba Company was started in the year 1953. The Girl Guides of St. Ann's High School, are annually trained for the Rastrapathi award under the guidance of the Guide Captain. They also attend Camps, hikes organized at State Level and National Level.

In the sports arena St. Ann's has produced national and international stars. Miss Reetha Rai represented India at the Junior Asiad for throws. The International power lifter Mrs. Bhanumathi Mendon was also a product of St. Ann's High school.

The school has always encouraged pupils in the field of music. The school brass band has participated in a number of religious and cultural programmes in the District. The pupils have won the Rolling Shield for the competitions organized by the Mangalore Musical and Cultural association for the last two years.

Computers are called electronic brains. To expose our pupils to this marvel of science thereby making them proficient in the modern demand of the work place a Computer Course was initiated in January 1996 to mark the 125 years jubilee of the school. The Computer centre was donated by the Aubrey D'Souza Charitable Trust.

STAFF:

Keeping up to the motto of 'Excelsior' the staff of St. Ann's High School were rewarded for their enterprising and self sacrificing efforts for the cause of education.

Sr. Virgilia, the Headmistress of this school from 1978-1987 was the recipient of the State and National award

by the Government for her unique contribution to the cause of education.

Mrs. Muktha Bai Basty, M.A, B.Ed among the staff from 1964-1991 won the State level 'Best Hindi Teacher Award' in 1991 instituted by the Department of Public Instruction, Bangalore.

Mr. Vaman Nandavar, M.A, B. Ed secured a Doctorate from the Mangalore University for a case study about cultural twin heroes of Tulunadu- Kitchennaya: A folkloristic study, under the guidance of professor B.A. Viveka Rai, Being a literacy genius, Mr. Nandavar won the Karnataka Sahitya Academy award in 1992 for 'BEERA'- a collection of poems. In the same year a collection of articles "TULUVERE KUSAL KUSEL"- won for him an award from the Central Institute of Indian Languages.

The beginnings of Carmel English School go back to the 1940s. As some parents in the locality were desirous of getting English education for their children, the Carmel English Medium School was setup in 1951 and recognized by the Education Department in1964 and finally permanent recognition was granted in 1975-76. The Carmel Preparatory School was established in June 1967.



Our Lady of Mount Carmel is the **Patroness of Carmel English School**.

History and Progress of our Educational Institution:

St. Ann's College of Education is a premier College of Teacher Education in India. The College started in 1943, is the first private training College in Karnataka State. This institution has got recognition from University Grant Commission (UGC) under 2f in 1981 and under 12B in 1993. The college became Autonomous from the academic year 2007-2008.

The Undergraduate College of Education as it stepped into its fiftieth year became a Post-graduate College of Education. The M.Ed. Course, at present is permanently affiliated to the Mangalore University, commenced in 1992-93 as a golden landmark, during the GOLDEN JUBILEE YEAR of the College. The introduction of the Course, Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications (P.G.D.C.A.) with Teaching of Computer Science as a Special paper in 1997-98, affiliated to Mangalore University is another unique feature of this institution. The College has been offering Diploma in 'Pre-Primary Teachers' Training Course' from 2004. The College is a Study Centre for M.Ed. Course of Karnataka State Open University (K.S.O.U.) and Partner Institute of IGNOU.

In 2008 the College has been recognized as a Research Centre for Ph.D. studies in Education by Mangalore University. The first assessment by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in 2001 with Five Star Status set the pace for the future. The year 2009 brought new accomplishments and achievements when it was reaccredited by NAAC with an 'A' Grade and CGPA of 3.63/4.0 making it the highest ranking institution among all the colleges affiliated to Mangalore University and among all the re-accredited Colleges of Education in India.

Present activities and achievements

St. Ann's Teacher Training Institute, Mangalore offers **D.Ed. Course** both in **Kannada** and **English Medium** of two years' duration inclusive of Internship of a period of three months which is under the regulations of Directorate of State Educational Research and Training

(DSERT) and is recognized by the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE). The approved intake by NCTE is 50. Ref.: F.SRO/NCTE/D.Ed-A1/2004-2005 dated 12.12.2004

The Management of the Apostolic Carmel Educational Society (Reg.), Karnataka state, St. Ann's Convent, Mangalore which runs the Teacher Training Institute for Women (D.Ed. – Kannada Medium) for over 123 years has also started D.Ed. English Section with permission granted by NCTE in 2007 and medium of instruction approved by the Government of Karnataka in 2009, as a need for the same was deeply felt. It is the concern of the Management that good teachers are trained for teaching in English Medium Schools at the Elementary Level as there are no training institutes for such teachers in the District of Dakshina Kannada. Besides, the number of Elementary English Medium schools is ever on the increase.
